#### **Readings for next Sunday**

Isaiah 55:1-9 1 Corinthians 10:1-13 Luke 13:1-9



Jesus' lament over Jerusalem employs a powerful and heartbreaking image - the mother hen who tenderly protects her chicks. There's that

fierce, unselfish love that's willing to do whatever it takes to care for the chicks, even if it means losing one's life, and Jesus will soon embody that kind of love.

Tom Wright draws on the image of a "farmyard fire" as the threat to the hen's babies, when "those cleaning up have found a dead hen, scorched and blackened, and live chicks sheltering under her wings." In the same way, Jesus longed to save Jerusalem, to warn her of impending doom; she would not listen to his warnings, and he would end up offering his life as well (*Luke for Everyone*).

There is also that persistent, unbreakable kind of love that Timothy Shapiro describes, when he compares Jesus to the mother hen whose love cannot be deterred by anything her little chick does or fails to do: "he's the mother hen who folds the covers down on the bed and puffs up the pillow, at the same time saying, 'Don't let me ever catch you doing that again'". What a beautiful way to describe both accountability and mercy!
