Imagine dragging yourself down the road to your father's estate afraid that he will not accept you back, practicing your speech over and over: "Father,

I have sinned against heaven and against you. I no longer deserve to be called your son; treat me as you would treat one of your hired workers".

You and I also have the same fear. So we make a Lenten "firm purpose of amendment." We want to be "worthy" before God, with our sins hidden.

But pay very close attention to the young man's father in the parable. He spots his prodigal son far down the road, the boy still memorising his lines. Did his father fold his arms and put on an angry face? Not at all. He sets out running. The boy tries to blunder out his lines. 'I have sinned terribly! I am no longer worthy of ...'

His father drowns him out, calling for the finest robe in the house, plus a ring for the young man's finger, sandals for his feet, and a huge banquet for celebration. He understands. He is ecstatic that his son came home.

Apply that now to you and me. "I know what you have done, child," says God. "You are precious to me, and not because you never sin. I love you, you are forgiven. Let me hug you."
